Director's Report

Established in 2007, the Rape and Sexual Abuse Centre, Perth and Kinross (RASAC

P&K) aims to relieve the distress of women and and advance education amongst professionals, the general public, and young people. By focusing on the causes, nature, prevalence, and effects of abuse we seek to prevent sexual violence and challenge harmful societal attitudes that exist.


It is with great pleasure that I write my first Annual Report as Chair of RASAC P&K. It has been quite an incredible year for the organisation. As reported in previous years, RASAC P&K has experienced a further increase in demand (153% across the last 5 years). In response to this it was evident that the organisation needed to seek new premises and having looked for some time, we relocated in June. This gave us the perfect opportunity to consult with survivors in shaping the layout and design of the new premises. Feedback to date has been overwhelming and we feel incredibly relieved to be able to offer survivors a more accessible space within which they can access a range of our services.

As noted above, we are seeing an unprecedented demand for support services with 176 new referrals across 18/19 and 297 people in service. The success of our young people and families project has enabled more support to be offered to family members and this year 25 family members accessed one to one support. However, we can never become complacent, continually trying to manage waiting times in order to be as responsive as possible. As we move in to uncertain times with a changing political landscape it is more important than ever that we continue to evidence how vital rape crisis services are for survivors, their supporters and our communities.

RASAC Youth Initiative has had yet another busy and productive year, engaging with 6000+ young people across Perth & Kinross and working alongside our dedicated RASAC Youth Ambassadors for another year. The commitment that our 18 Ambassadors have made in challenging sexual violence and promoting equality is nothing short of inspirational. Furthermore, our training has been well received with over 50 staff participating in our Trauma Informed Practice multi-agency training as well as a number of organisations reaching out for a range of training which promotes improved responses to survivors.

Partnership working remains central to much of our work and continued participation in a range of strategic and multi-agency groups has strengthened service provision and influenced change. Significant developments this year included the extension of SARN (Sexual Assault Referral Network) and the opening of a dedicated forensic suite out with Bell Street Police Station. We valued this collaborative work and feedback to date has reinforced the importance of an appropriate setting when providing much needed trauma informed responses.

On behalf of the Board of Directors, we hope you find this year's report informative. As we enter 2019/20, we will continue to develop and deliver services in response to the needs identified by survivors and we very much look forward to continuing this vital work.



RASAC P&K Support Services


We have had another very busy year with an increasingly lengthy waiting list which greatly impacts survivors who are waiting up to 6 months for support. This growth in the waiting list is in conjunction with us increasing our service provision by 24% in the last 12 months.


To alleviate the impact of survivors waiting we continue to offer Crisis Support by providing 3 crisis support sessions, Helpline support 5 days per week and a weekly Drop In service for survivors before they commence Therapeutic Support.

Survivors report a range of effects which impact their mental health as well as their social, educational and employment inclusion, highlighting the importance of our specialist Therapeutic and Justice Advocacy support in Perth and Kinross.

Below you will see our key support services numbers and activities throughout the year as well as how we aim to be inclusive of survivor's and professionals needs.

THE IMPACT OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE CANNOT BE UNDERESTIMATED. ONE OF THE BIGGEST CHALLENGES THAT WE HAVE AS AN ORGANISATION, (WHICH IS ALL TOO OFTEN FELT BY SURVIVORS) IS THAT MANY PEOPLE MINIMISE OR SIMPLY DO NOT REALISE HOW HARMFUL AND DEVASTATING THE SHORT AND LONG-TERM CONSEQUENCES OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE CAN BE TO INDIVIDUALS, FAMILIES AND SOCIETY AS A WHOLE.

Increasing Capacity to Meet the Pemand

As well as increasing our ability to provide support through the expansion of our new premises we have recruited 3 new Therapeutic Support Workers and a part-time Team Leader to tackle the large waiting list we have had over the last couple of years.

At a time when waiting list and referrals are increasing year on year, we were delighted to hear that the Scottish Government has increased funding to Rape Crisis Centres throughout Scotland enabling RASAC P&K to start tacking our waiting list.

YEAR ON YEAR WE HAVE INCREASED THE NUMBER OF WOMEN AND YOUNG PEOPLE WE HAVE WORKED WITH DUE TO THE DEMAND FOR OUR SUPPORT SERVICES. HOWEVER IT IS A CHALLENGE TO KEEP UP WITH THE INCREASING DEMAND WITH THE LIMITED RESOURCES WE HAVE IN PLACE.

How we work towards Inclusion

New Accessible Premises - Our new premises are accessible throughout the ground floor with a newly fitted accessible toilet ensuring all survivors can access support, group activities, and the resource library and waiting room.

Service Delivery - Provide regular; non appointment based drop in, provide helpline, provide evening and day time appointments, support is provided through; face to face, email, phone, video, letter and outreach.

RASAC Support Services

Complex Needs Support

We continue to work with women with additional complex needs who find it hard to engage by offering specialist tailored service provision that fully acknowledges the challenges and additional barriers to support such as; repeat offending, criminal complex needs convictions, substance misuse, homelessness and being involved in commercial sexual exploitation.

Women with identified supported

We have continued our successful partnership with the One Stop Women's Learning Service (OWLS), a Criminal Justice project for women involved in repeat offending, with RASAC having a weekly drop in session at their premises. It took us many months to build up a trusting relationship with the women with referrals now increasing each year. Once again a group of women from OWLS participated in our yearly 'Reclaim the Night' March having been inspired by last year's march around Perth as part of the 16 day of action to end VAW.

We have also developed projects with St Catherines Square (accommodation for individuals with complex needs and homelessness) and with Churches Action for the Homeless which we will be delivering in the next year.

We continue our partnership work with Encompass sharing and developing good practice in preventing commercial sexual exploitation, as well as supporting women involved in selling or exchanging sexual activity in Perth and Kinross. ENCOMPASS

SEXUAL ASSAULT REFERRAL NETWORK – SARN

One of our key Justice Advocacy developments this year is the extension of the SARN facilities. SARN helps facilitate access to a forensic medical examination without having to report to the Police and can take place up to 7 days after a sexual assault has taken place; the evidence that is gathered is then stored anonymously and can be accessed at a future date if the survivor feels that they are ready to report.

We worked in partnership with NHS Tayside, WRASAC Dundee & Angus, and Police Scotland and have now identified and set up a purpose





THE DIFFERENCE SUPPORT CAN MAKE

The difference that support can make is evidenced in the graph to the right and the messages of hope we receive from the survivors using our services as seen below. We have met hundreds of survivors over the years and each of them inspire us with their determination to move through their trauma and pain. We use a number of tools to measure where survivors are in their healing journey which enables us to see how effective our services are as well as evaluating the techniques we use in our therapeutic support. As a reflective organisation we continually assess and develop our services according to needs identified within

This year we finalised the review of our evaluation tool 'The Wheel' which identifies the effects of sexual violence in survivors lives, and the improvements in these effects during and at the end of support. The review enabled us to improve on the Wheel's effectiveness, reflecting the lived in experience of survivors. This has enabled us to better understand survivor's needs and better report to our partners and funders.



Increasing our Accessibility and Capacity to Support.

Through our increasing waiting list and our limited accessibility it was identified that our premises of 6 years were no longer suitable for our service users needs. After an extensive and ongoing search we identified and moved into the premises next door!



Our new premises were fully refurbished based on staff and service users needs and feedback around what made a safe, welcoming and comfortable space. We now have an additional Support Room (3 in total), a dedicated Group Room, a welcoming Waiting Area with Resource Library and a Training Room. This has greatly increased our capacity to deliver our support and prevention services as well as give the staff and volunteer team a bit more room to

Prevention Services - RASAC youth Initiative

Over the past year RYI has maintained and extended our networking and partnership work enabling us to develop new connections and collaborative opportunities. We are pleased that we have extended our sexual violence prevention provision in 3 schools with delivery to additional year groups. We have also been able to support school and youth prevention projects such as Mentors in Violence Prevention training as well as delivery of workshops to Police Scotland Youth Volunteers. We have strengthened our links with Perth College/UHI through delivery of prevention workshops and awareness raising activities as well as supporting them with the delivery of the Equally Safe Higher Education toolkit on the campus. In addition we continue to maintain and develop our Youth

Ambassador programme supporting young people to engage with local and national consultation and events

throughout Scotland as well as continue their delivery of prevention workshops. On a note of celebration we were awarded Police Scotland Youth Volunteers Perth's partnership recognition award and a group of young people from Perth Grammar school won £3000 Youth Philanthropy monies for us which is enabling us to further support young survivors and prevention work. We look forward to continuing our work in the next year believing that we and the young people we work with need to be the change in the world that we want to see.

The RASAC Youth and Student Ambassadors are a group of young people aged 14yrs to 18+yrs who actively challenge gender inequality and gender expectations in society leading to the reduction and eradication of sexual violence. Through the RASAC Youth Initiative all the Youth and Student Ambassadors receive comprehensive training and support to understand sexual violence and skills in delivering workshops to other young people and adults, in youth groups, community groups and college/university.

Across this year we have remained committed to partnership working and embraced the many opportunities which this brings to addressing Violence Against Women locally. Being part of a wide range of multi-agency and strategic groups significantly enhances the work we do with our participation giving us the opportunity to advocate for survivors and inform local strategy and community planning. We are privileged to work alongside many other dedicated professionals who share their good practice and who work with us to improve the identification of, and responses to, sexual violence. As always, such partnership work informs our day to day services, links in to our Strategic Plan and drives forward the support of survivors and their families living in P&K.

The Perth & Kinross Violence Against Women Partnership has continued to be an enormous support to RASAC P&K and our work addressing sexual violence. Through the Partnership we have worked collaboratively to plan and deliver another hugely successful 16 Days of Action to End Violence Against Women, taking the lead on the organising of Reclaim the Night, supported by many other dedicated organisations and services. Furthermore, we contributed to the submission of the Scottish Government's Consultations on the FGM Bill and the Clinical Pathways and Guidance for Healthcare Professionals Working to Support Adults who Present Having Experienced Rape or Sexual Assault in Scotland.

In addition we continue to to be part of the Perth & Kinross Child Sexual Exploitation Working Group protectively working across localities. The Young People's CSE Advisory Group has gone from strength to strength, consulting with staff on publications and designing a CSE

Working closely with Police Scotland, NHS Tayside, WRASAC Dundee & Angus and Rape Crisis Scotland, we have increased the operating hours of SARN (the Sexual Assault Referral Network) as highlighted in our Justice Advocacy Service report on pg 4.

We are thankful to have been invited to join the Corporate Parenting Sub Group. This is a new area of work for us at RASAC P&K and has supported us in thinking more creatively about how we can best support survivors who have experienced care. This is something we hope to build upon over the next year. Furthermore, through our participation in the Third Sector Community Justice Forum we have accepted an invite to present at the Community Justice Partnership. We are committed to raising awareness, and strengthening understanding, about survivors experiences within the Justice System and welcome any opportunity to work with those at the forefront of strategic planning around this.



RASAC P&K Statistics...








SURVIVORS AGE AT START OF ABUSE




REPORTING TO POLICE


GENDERED ANALYSIS OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE

The majority of victims and survivors of sexual violence in Scotland are women and children and the majority of their perpetrators are male. This is reflected in our statistics above. We describe this as gender based violence.

We believe that gender based violence is a direct result of gender inequality. The expected gender roles and behaviours assigned to men and women, boys and girls, are shaped and reinforced by society, defining appropriate behaviour for women and men often creating inequalities. These inequalities ultimately enable violence against women and children to manifest in society.

To combat gender based violence we must work towards changing societies attitudes towards gender for the benefit of men, women and children. This approach is known as a 'gendered analysis' and can be found at the core of all Rape Crisis centres in Scotland as well as the Scottish Governments Violence Against Women strategy 'Equally Safe'.

RELATIONSHIP OF ABUSER



The message that society tells us is 'stranger danger' and although we recognise that sexual violence is perpetrated by strangers (15% this year) the statistics above clearly show that unfortunately you are most likely to experience sexual violence perpetrated by someone you know well. Our largest category is 'Other Known Person' this includes, youth workers, sports coaches and peers/friends.

We have had a significant growth in the number of survivors identifing perpetrators as 'strangers' in the last 12 months. Last year they represented 8% of all survivors, this year, it almost doubles to 15%. Anecdotal evidence suggest there may be a link to this increase with dating websites/apps.


